

I'm sure you had the pleasure of meeting her at our some of our meetings or at annual picnics – picnics she hardly every missed. In addition to attending local club events, at which she had the opportunity to meet bonsai master John Naka, Jean was a frequent attendee of the MABS Spring Festival.
